

Minutes of the meeting of the Faculty Council held on Tuesday, September 28, 2021 at 3:00 p.m. via the Zoom Conferencing Application.

SECTION I - INTR ODUCTORY BUSINESS

1. Welcoming Remarks

The Interim Dean and Chair, Dr. Mary Hunter, welcomed everyone and before going any further declared that McGill University is on land which has long served as a site of meeting and exchange amongst Indigenous peoples, including the Haudenosaunee and Anishinabeg nations. The Chair acknowledged and thanked the diverse Indigenous peoples whose presence marks this territory on which people of the world now gather.

Quorum was achieved with more than 50 voting members present. The meeting was called to order at 3:05 pm.

2. Announcements
