The Department of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) is launching a National Essay Challenge for graduate students in Canadian universities to promote innovative and relevant research. The NEC is designed to generate evidence-based insights on IRCC policies, engaging graduate students to learn more about immigration research and policy, and raising awareness about the availability of data and supporting resources.

The NEC is open to all disciplines and welcomes empirical research papers related to IRCC's current graduate qualitative or quantitative methodologies. Graduate students with selected essays will be invited to present their research to policy makers in Ottawa (with travel paid) and will receive \$500 towards attendance at an academic conference of their choice.

**Requirements:**

- You must be a graduate student enrolled at a Canadian university for the 2019 to 2020 academic year.
- Your essay must be either an empirical research paper, using qualitative or quantitative methodologies.
- The essay cannot be co-authored and you must have the support of a professor.

To enter, send an email to [IRCC.NEC@ic.gc.ca](mailto:IRCC.NEC@ic.gc.ca) to access the National Essay Challenge group on GCcollab, where you will find information about the requirements of the Challenge. Once you are a member of the group, you will need to submit your expression of interest by January 6, 2020.

If you are planning to access Statistics Canada's Research Data Centers, you will need to have submitted your proposal by November 6, 2019.
