Avenues of Research

- development of screening tools for mental disorders and alcohol dependence disorders
- design and evaluation of community interventions targeted at adults, adolescent and children's exposure to organized violence
- Strategies for promotion and healing of mental health professionals

Establishing Partnerships

Partnerships were established with governmental institutions or organizations to conduct research:

- To obtain authorization/licenses

- To get the go-ahead from authorities in the research process and in future interventions

- To recruit participants

- To promote the strengthened of organizations

- To provide health care to participants

Case study of community-based interventions for the strengthening of social networks in two Puerto Rican communities

- Assess community-based strategies and level of participation of different organizations and community groups and the influence in community and health sector activities in two sites in the Province of Puerto Rico, Aguas Buenas and Santia#o de .ado
- Determine community empowerment levels after the intervention
- To determine if collaboration and partnerships between groups and organizations has developed
- To evaluate the social processes that had facilitated, underlined community support networks
- To identify the identified outcomes from the community-based intervention

Case study of community-based interventions for the strengthening of social networks in two Puerto Rican communities

Evaluation of the distance course on Mental health in Education: Promotion and Prevention

Explore the quality of the process of learning and teaching of the mental health course from the perspective of the students

Know the perceptions of the students regarding what they learned

Explore if the students transferred what they learned to their practice

Review of course documents such as syllabus, evaluation forms, etc., online surveys, interviews, and focus group discussions

Interactive exchange was limited to technology and students' attitude towards

Psychological Well-being and the Environment

Explore how mental health and psychological well-being (i.e. influenced by) is a function of residence (high or low) within the district of London.

Workshop on data collection of domestic violence-related data

Build alliances in analysis of information, to enable professionals of different disciplines and institutions interested in investment in the field of violence to present descriptive and analysis results and to author scientific articles

Promote intersectorial and interdisciplinary investments in the field of violence and research

A database of about 1777 surveys was available to be analyzed. Theoretical sessions were conducted to evaluate this data

Participants of the workshop prepared a scientific poster based on the analysis realized during the workshop and presented their findings in an interinstitutional event

Predictive factors for violent behaviour are:

Sex*, as men are more likely to act favourably on recent violence than women do
